Ida Gaye Robinette was born October 8, 1949, in Amarillo, Texas to Joe Elvis Wright and Betty Lou (Robinette) Wright. She passed away on August 14, 2022 in Coppell, Texas.

Gaye relocated to Arlington, Texas during her High School years when her father was transferred to Southwestern Bell in Dallas. Gaye was a true artist, both musically as well as visually. As a graduate of Arlington High School, and a member of the Arlington Colt Marching band, Gaye was an avid music lover. She played the flute and piano. She was the top flutist in her band. On January 2, 1967, Gaye, along with the Colt marching band were participants in the Rose Bowl Parade. Gaye could also be heard playing organ for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Another extension of her musical talent was her singing, she was a long-time volunteer of the (Southwestern) Bell Singers. She especially liked singing during Christmas time. Gaye also expressed her appreciation for the visual arts by volunteering at art museums. Her favorite was the Ramses the Great exhibit in 1989 at the State Fair of Texas. She also loved to attend musicals with her friends.

Gaye graduated from Arlington High School in 1967. After graduation, Gaye attended the University of Texas at Arlington. While there, she met Michael Jaffarzadeh. They were married and relocated to Shiraz, Iran, where her daughter Bonnie was born in 1975. Gaye and family returned to Arlington in 1976, which is when Gaye continued a career as a Service Order Writer at Southwestern Bell in Downtown Dallas. Gaye retired from Southwestern Bell

in 2003 after 30 years of years of service.

Gaye enjoyed an active retirement taking cruises, spending time with her family enjoying her cat Shadow and attending worship services.

Gaye was preceded in death by her parents, Joe and Betty Wright, her brother Joe Elvis Wright, Jr. and nephew Robby Wright.

She leaves to cherish her memories her daughter Bonnie (Stefon) Fleming, of Coppell, Texas, and grandchildren Deion, Natalie and Isaiah. She also leaves a niece Kim and cousins, aunts, uncles and other relatives.
